

### **GRACE** is Giving & Receiving Assistance for our Community's Essentials.

It is everyone's birthright to be happy, healthy and secure. GRACE meets community needs with community resources to enable the good health and success of our vulnerable and underserved neighbors. We start with the philosophy that our community's resources can fill any need in our community.

#### **Solutions**

We distribute food, essential supplies and stabilizing support to Summit residents and those who work, worship and receive care in Summit every Thursday from 11am to 1pm and 4pm to 7pm at the Summit Community Center at 100 Morris Avenue.

We respond to needs identified by the people we serve.

GRACE is a vital source for our community to get the nutritious food and household supplies they need. We distribute food and supplies every week to our neighbors in need, including: fresh produce with choice table products, milk, eggs and protein, bread, toilet tissue, diaper supplies and period products.

We provide direct access to essential programs and services available to help families realize their full potential. With stabilizing support services provided by community partners, we provide an accessible single stop for busy families to receive individualized and culturally relevant support.

We are more than a food bank - we help our people tend to larger goals such as getting vaccinated against COVID and the flu, obtaining a driver's license or photo identification, understanding affordable health insurance options, obtaining assistance for utility bills, supporting literacy and employment opportunities, supporting health and dietary needs, and providing enrichment programming.

### 2023 Year in Review. GRACE at the core.

In February of 2023 we met a record high number of families served, with 713 households supplied with food and essentials in one week. We re-positioned ourselves to meet this increased demand, creating diversion plans and making warm referrals so that families could better find their needs served closer to home.

On **April 19** GRACE extended hours to include an afternoon distribution. In an effort to invest in the stabilizing efforts and afford our families more individualized attention while minimizing traffic and parking concerns, we more than doubled our hours. Creating flexibility for heads of households balancing many responsibilities, including seniors who found easier accessibility in the daylight hours of the afternoon.

In **May** we began plans to move to the Summit Community Center. In **June** GRACE moved from the Cornog Field House to the Summit Community Center, where we now provide distribution and services indoors, and have expanded our stabilizing services with on-site community partners. Now indoors and out of the dark and cold, services are more accessible and we've continued to be a reliable source of support for more than 500 local families each week.



During the **Summer** we bolstered enrichment offerings and surveyed our families, to better serve their needs, adding Tennis Clinics with Summit Serves, Salsa Dancing with the YMCA, and Art Therapy with the Visual Arts Center of NJ. We began to provide weekly assistance for COVID boosters and flu shots, career guidance and benefits enrollment on site, thanks to Union County Department of Human Services.

As the colder **Fall** season approached, coats, hats and gloves were provided to more than 575 individuals, providing safety, warmth and comfort through the cold season.



In **October** GRACE launched our ESOL programs, in partnership with the City of Summit Department of Community Programs. We continued our distribution of Halloween costumes to ensure that every student and child may feel a sense of inclusivity during community celebrations.

With increasing demand, comes need for increased support. On **October 6**, GRACE raised over \$100,000 to benefit GRACE at our inaugural fundraiser, *An Evening for GRACE to benefit our neighbors in need*, where we also honored those who make GRACE a reality & celebrated our successes together.



In **November**, GRACE served a warm meal to more than 200 individuals at our 2nd Annual Community Thanksgiving, in partnership with the City of Summit Department of Community Programs.


During the **Winter** GRACE continued to provide services during our darkest and coldest months, when need remained high. GRACE partnered with the YWCA for domestic violence intervention. We celebrated another season of giving, ensuring that every recipient received gifts to share with their families during the season of giving, thanks to the Lions Club of Summit, Toy Professor, and neighbors from all across the community who supported us.


### Every person who came in need, received.



### 2023 Distribution by the Numbers


### Distribution by County

# **Engaging our Youth**

#### **Youth Advisory Council**

High school students from public and private schools from the area gather to complete service projects and to discuss current community issues with local leaders each month. Topics of discussion have included equity in education, community policing, and accessible health care. In 2023, this group arranged a fundraiser at Panera Bread and a bake sale at Summit High School to support fundraising efforts and raise awareness in our community. During the Summer they planned, coordinated and ran activities at the Summit Community Pool for a summer opening pool party that was made accessible and free of charge to all Summit residents.

#### **Eighth Grade Volunteer Program**

Be it community service hours for school or time spent volunteering in preparation for confirmation or B'nai Mitzvot, or just a desire to join our team, we welcome kids ages 13 and older to volunteer independently. With readiness to serve, many fill our sign up just as soon as we post the opportunity. While serving, youth learn about our community's realities in direct service and make friends while directing their efforts to uplifting their neighbors.

#### **Our Youngest Volunteers**

Our youngest volunteers make an impact! In 2023, Cornerstone and Central Presbyterian Nursery schools visited GRACE on field trips. GRACE staff visited Brayton, Temple Sinai and Lincoln-Hubbard Elementary Schools. During visits we discussed wants versus needs, how to help when a neighbor is in need, and prepared food bags and pajama packages for the GRACE community.

Families with young children stay involved and support shelf stable grocery bagging on Sunday mornings. Girl Scout troops, the local elementary schools, and other groups involving our youngest volunteers, support volunteer efforts with service and support of donation drives.
